PLANNING THE SERVICE

BEFORE DEATH OCCURS

The Pastor will be happy to visit with you and provide a planning document. Once completed, a permanent file will be made and your data base record will reflect that you have pre-planned yourservice.

WHEN DEATH IS IMMINENT OR WHEN DEATH OCCURS

When a death is imminent our pastor is honored to come and pray with you. If there is time, please call the church office at 217-428-3327. We will make every effort to have someone come to you.

If this is after-hours, please call the emergency number: 217-413 -7904. The pastor will return your call as soon as possible.

DATE, TIME AND PLACE OF SERVICE

If you wish for our pastor to conduct the funeral for your loved one, please visit with him or her before you schedule. To avoid personal and building conflicts the pastor will speak with funeral home or mortuary regarding requests. Funerals and memorials are often held in our sanctuary. It can seat 150 people. Services can also be held at local funeral homes and cemeteries. Whatever the choice, we try to accommodate your wishes.

TYPE OF SERVICE

- 1. A traditional funeral (where the casket is present), graveside to follow
- 2. A memorial service (where there is no casket)
- 3. A graveside service only
- 4. A graveside service prior to the memorial service

Additionally, a visitation can be scheduled before the service on the service day or the evening before. Often, the family provides a video tribute. The video must be in DVD format, ready to play.

music

Music is an integral part of any worship service here at Prairie Avenue. So often music can speak volumes when we are unable to speak ourselves. There is great and wonderful church music available in the traditional or contemporary styles. We have musicians and vocalists able to provide either. The pastor will help you choose appropriate music for the service. Secular music is not encouraged for a service but can be used during the visitation.

Prelude: The organist/pianist will play for 20 minutes prior to the service. This will include requested hymn or a selection of the musician's choice.

Processional: The family will walk into the sanctuary with the pastor and be seated.

Solo and congregational hymns: These complement the service and will be interspersed at the discretion of the pastor.

Recessional: The casket (if applicable), pastor and family exit the chapel to this music usually played in an uplifting tempo.

Postlude: the organist/pianist will play until the guests have left the sanctuary.

MAKING SERVICE PLANS

Following the selection of the date, time, place and type of service the minister will arrange to gather the family and learn the stories. This meeting can either be at the family home or at the church. This will be a time to select favorite scripture and discuss musical choices as well.

The minister works behind the scenes to handle all logistics. They work with the family and often the funeral home to make sure all details are covered. They contact the musicians and soloists, as well as custodial services to present a proper and fitting tribute. The will ask about the number of guests you might expect and discuss processional procedure and seating of the family and honored guests.

FEES

There are no fees for funerals or memorials held at Prairie Avenue Christian Church. If outside musicians or vocalists are invited, the family is responsible for those participants. If asked, the minister will provide a list of suggested honoraria, which is only a guideline.

FLOWERS

Floral offerings are a wonderful way to pay tribute to a loved one. The beautiful plants and blooms honor God's creation of life. Removal of the arrangements is the responsibility of the family or the funeral home.

- Guest book

AFTER CARE

Your church does not want you to feel you are alone following your loss. We send grief booklets through the first year which offer words of hope and encouragement.

We hold a service of healing especially designed for those who have suffered loss near Christmas.

There is also the intentional provision of remembrance on the first Sunday in November as All Saints Sunday.
